#### MASTER BUILDERS AUSTRALIA NATIONAL EXCELLENCE AWARD

At the MBA National Awards held in Canberra during November 2014, Vos was successful in winning a Master Builders Australia National Excellence award for the Devonport Aquatic Centre in the Commercial/Industrial Construction (\$10 million to \$20 million) category. The Melbourne Park project involved the redevelopment of Margaret Court Arena. All aspects of work undertaken by Vos are key interior features of the building and contribute to a truly spectacular public space.

Other successes recently were the Australian and New Zealand Property Journal Environmental Development Award for the Sustainability Learning Centre at Mt Nelson, and the Property Review Australia Heritage Award for the restoration of the Tasmanian Museum and Art Gallery.

#### AJL HEAVY EQUIPMENT NEW WORKSHOP AND SHOWROOM

This project completed in March this year on the site of the former Australian Paper Mill in Burnie is new home for AJL's heavy equipment, parts and hiring business.

The two storey, multi-layered complex includes a spacious and modern elliptical shaped showroom, a service workshop fitted out with state of the art equipment and a boardroom taking full advantage of the ocean views.





#### **BLUNDSTONE ARENA UPGRADE**

Vos finished building the Western Grand Stand and Administration Centre at Blundstone Arena ahead of the World Cup Cricket tournament held earlier this year. The project consisted of the demolition of the existing grandstands and the construction of a new 4,500 seat grandstand, a new three level administration block, a basement carpark, concourse and associated landscaping.

The redevelopment gave a significant boost to the Tasmanian construction industry creating over 300 jobs during the construction phase. It will be a hub for international cricket, AFL football and other major sporting events in the future which will help promote Tasmania both nationally and globally.



#### ST GILES THERAPY CENTRE

The St Giles Therapy Centre in Launceston was completed during March 2015.

The project involved the construction of a new two storey therapy and administration centre which is connected to the existing buildings. The main therapy area is located on the ground floor and comprises a number of observation, consulting and activity rooms. The administration offices and staff rooms are located upstairs.

The building is visually interesting with numerous features such as laminated ply columns in the shape of trees down the main corridor, curved polycarbonate roofing and brightly coloured external cladding. We are proud of the quality that we have been able to achieve and the benefit this new facility will bring to children and adults with developmental delays and disabilities.



#### FLOOD LEVEE WALKWAY

Vos completed stages 4 and 5 of the Launceston Flood Levee project comprising the Levee Walkway and Cycleway in December 2014.

The system of walkways is around 380 metres long and includes an Inveresk Museum viewing platform centrally located along the pathway.

There are also a series of on grade cycle and walkway paths that link all of the areas together. This provides many options for people that are out for a walk or cycle and certainly attains one of the Launceston Flood Authority's goals of returning the river back to the people.



## TOLL TASMANIA BRIGHTON FREIGHT TERMINAL

Construction of the new Toll Tasmania freight terminal in Brighton is now complete. Toll Tasmania is the largest freight forwarder to and from Tasmania specialising in palletised and bulk transport, and also temperature-controlled distribution services. We are proud to have been appointed by Toll Tasmania to undertake this project.

In 2011, we met a Launceston family who had four children; two of them with severe disabilities. They were unable to go anywhere as a family in their Camry and life was tough in a number of ways however they remained intentionally positive and were inspirational despite their hardship.

We were able to source and purchase a late model Toyota HiAce Commuter Van already set up to take two wheelchairs as well as having seating for the rest of the family.

They were blown away when we turned up with it in the driveway. They kept in contact with us, giving us flowers every Christmas which was not needed but gratefully accepted as it was their way of saying thank you and they told us how the van changed their lives.

Sadly, both children with the disabilities passed away and we were very surprised to receive a cheque in the mail from the funeral services. After enquiring, we learnt that the family shared with the mourners about how Vos

Foundation had changed their lives and they wanted to give something back so they passed the hat around to raise money.

As the family is of aboriginal descent we decided to multiply the donation we had received and forward a cheque to an indigenous early childhood program in North Queensland set up by Compassion Australia (See picture to right) that is making an enormous difference and that the Queensland Government is keen to adopt as a very effective model.
